Alpha Course: Stay Curious 2023

Curious about faith?

Why not join a series of group conversations that freely explore the basics of the Christian faith in an open, friendly environment.

At each Alpha Session you'll be hosted in a small group and watch an episode each week on a different question of faith. You will have a chance to share your thoughts and hear what others think. You can say anything you like or nothing at all.

EVERYONE'S WELCOME. You are invited no matter your background or beliefs. It's free and there is no pressure.

Stay Curious: Course Venue, Content and Timetable

Venue

This free weekly course, facilitated by Fr Jamie Houghton and others, takes place in the St Paul's Catholic Church Hall, immediately adjacent to the Church, 103 Maison Dieu Road, Dover CT16 1RU.

Free car parking is available in the Pencester Car Park, just opposite the front of the church and in the church car park located behind the church.

Content

Each of the 10 weekly sessions commences with free light refreshment available from 6.40pm. We are conscious that some men and women may have come straight from work to attend and, therefore, a cup of tea or coffee and a biscuit or two are most welcome. There is also a Saturday given over to the Holy Spirit and the sharing of a meal - Saturday 18th November, is 'The Holy Spirit Day', for both the St Paul's and St Finbarr's Alpha groups, at St Finbarr's Church, Aylesham, CT3 3 EZ, 10.30am – 2pm, including a free fish and chip lunch!

Each week follows the same structure: welcome, introduction of the theme, video presentation and discussion.

Participation

Those attending are encouraged to say as much or as little as they wish. Experience has taught us that as the weeks progress and as everyone gets to know each other better and people feel more relaxed and comfortable in each other's company, both the number of questions asked increases and more and more people contribute to the discussions. Consequently, we ask that those attending will be generous with their time and the sharing of their knowledge, skills and understandings for the benefit of all.

After refreshment each of the sessions commences promptly at 7pm and finishes no later than 9pm. We are conscious that for those working they will want to see their family before the end of the day.

We encourage those attending to share the topic covered each evening and the highlights of the discussion so that those at home can share in the journey.

If you attend Mass here regularly, you will have heard about an Alpha course to begin here soon. My purpose is to tell you a little more about it and to encourage you to attend all or some of the course.

You're all here because either the Catholic faith has been yours from birth, or like me, you were drawn to it by a circumstance of your life, either way you MUST now know that you are called to be heralds of the Gospel of Christ.

Alpha could be a tool in your toolbox to help you to be that herald. Meaningful conversations about how faith influences our lives are difficult at any time, but for reasons, inexplicable to you and I, as committed Catholics, those conversations with Jesus at the heart of them, are almost impossible outside our Christian community. Could that be because in the 21st century Jesus is rarely discussed in family homes or non-Christian schools.

Alpha seeks to change that, to stimulate conversations about faith in a safe and comfortable environment, through an 11-session course of meetings that are free and open to everyone, whether you are curious about Jesus, who he is, what he did, or what he has to offer the world. These sorts of questions come from curious enquirers and from committed Christians, especially those wanting to be more confident in conversations about Jesus with family, friends, co-workers, or casual acquaintances.

The sessions are not formal discourses full of high-powered theology that none of us could easily understand. They are informal gatherings of you, me, your family, friends, and co-workers that you bring along for a tea or coffee, a bun or biscuit, and light-

hearted chat, which is followed by a short themed video, such as, "Is there more to life than this?" or "Why and how do I pray?" or "How can I resist evil?" and many more Christian themes.

After the video there is group discussion about it, which will be authentic and unforced, where opinions are welcomed and not challenged; the sessions end with a short period of prayer and song.

Though the course is 11 sessions, every Wednesday from 4th October to 20th December, and it is hoped attendees will go to each session, there is no commitment to do so. Visitors may attend as many sessions as they want to.
