SAVE ST PAUL'S: The Parish has received a reply from KCC. We had asked the Senior Project Manager of the Pencester Road Dover scheme to re-visit us in person to further discuss our concerns as they have dismissed them all as having no substance. They have also replied to some people, claiming and telling them that they have met all our concerns with adequate considerations with regards to the scheme. This claim is false and misleading. At present no return visit is forthcoming and we will, as a Parish, be responding back to KCC next week.

Some of you may have received a personal letter from KCC stating that they 'do not anticipate the proposals will require significant changes to any of the processes currently followed by St Paul's Church despite the initial concerns raised.' They also state in the letter that it is the responsibility of St Paul's to 'pro-actively manage health & safety matters and would expect this to extend to the safety associated with vehicles stopping outside the church attending services.

They are in effect taking that responsibility of pedestrian safety away from themselves and placing it in the hands of the church. We disagree most strongly with all the points they raise in the letter and we would urge you to reply as such. KCC have given 14 days from 11th March to lodge a further objection and we would urge you to respond by 22nd March at the latest. If you did not receive a letter from them but did sign our petition, you can still object by emailing pencesterroad@kent.gov.uk stating you signed the petition and wish to object further because of pedestrian and vehicle safety concerns outside St Paul's which is not the responsibility of the church and have not been fully addressed. We will continue to oppose this scheme because we are concerned about the safety of the large number that frequent our Church every week. Let us pray for a successful and safe outcome for St Paul's. God Bless. Fr Leo.

GOSPEL REFLECTION: (JN. 12:20-23) SERVE GOD WITH ALL YOU HAVE: Only a life spent for others

IF ANYONE SERVES ME, MY FATHER WILL HONOUR HIM. will be glorified, sometimes here in this world, but always in Heaven. We know that the world owes everything to people who have spent their time and talents for God and for their fellow human beings. Mother Teresa, for instance, gave up her comfortable teaching career, and with just 5 rupees (17 cents) in her pocket began her challenging life for the "poorest of the poor" in the crowded slums of Calcutta. We see similar cases in the history of great saints, scientists, and benefactors of mankind in all walks of life. They chose to burn out rather than to rust out. A

candle gives light by having its wick burned and its wax melted. Today's Gospel challenges us to make a difference in the lives of other people by our sacrificial service to those around us in the family and community, in the workplace, and in a wider society. Where is God calling you to serve? What talent can I share in my Church? Let us pray that we may acquire this self-sacrificing spirit, especially during Lent. Amen.

READINGS FOR SUNDAY 17TH MARCH 2024

First reading Jeremiah 31:31-34

I will make a new covenant

See, the days are coming – it is the Lord who speaks - when I will make a new covenant with the House of Israel (and the House of Judah), but not a covenant like the one I made with their ancestors on the day I took them by the hand to bring them out of the land of Egypt. They broke that covenant of mine, so I had to show them who was master. It is the Lord who speaks. No, this is the covenant I will make with the House of Israel when those days arrive – it is the Lord who speaks. Deep within them I will plant my Law, writing it on their hearts. Then I will be their God and they shall be my people. There will be no further need for neighbour to try to teach neighbour, or brother to say to brother, 'Learn to know the Lord!' No, they will all know me, the least no less than the greatest - it is the Lord who speaks – since I will forgive their iniquity and never call their sin to mind.

Responsorial Psalm 50(51):3-4,12-15 A pure heart create for me, O God.

Second reading Hebrews 5:7-9

He learned to obey and he became the source of eternal salvation

During his life on earth, Christ offered up prayer and entreaty, aloud and in silent tears, to the one who had the power to save him out of death, and he submitted so humbly that his prayer was heard. Although he was Son, he learnt to obey through suffering; but having been made perfect, he became for all who obey him the source of eternal salvation.

Gospel Acclamation Jn12:26 Glory to you, O Christ, you are the Word of God! Whoever serves me must follow me, says the Lord; and where I am, there also will my servant be. Glory to you, O Christ, you are the Word of God!

Gospel John 12:20-33

If a grain of wheat falls on the ground and dies, it yields a rich harvest

Among those who went up to worship at the festival were some Greeks. These approached Philip, who came from Bethsaida in Galilee, and put this request to him, 'Sir, we should like to see Jesus.' Philip went to tell Andrew, and Andrew and Philip together went to tell Jesus. Jesus replied to them:

'Now the hour has come

for the Son of Man to be glorified. I tell you, most solemnly, unless a wheat grain falls on the ground and dies, it remains only a single grain; but if it dies, it yields a rich harvest. Anyone who loves his life loses it; anyone who hates his life in this world will keep it for the eternal life. If a man serves me, he must follow me, wherever I am, my servant will be there too. If anyone serves me, my Father will honour him. Now my soul is troubled. What shall I say: Father, save me from this hour? But it was for this very reason that I have come to this hour. Father, glorify your name!'

A voice came from heaven, 'I have glorified it, and I will glorify it again.' People standing by, who heard this, said it was a clap of thunder; others said, 'It was an angel speaking to him.' Jesus answered, 'It was not for my sake that this voice came, but for yours.

'Now sentence is being passed on this world; now the prince of this world is to be overthrown. And when I am lifted up from the earth, I shall draw all men to myself.'

By these words he indicated the kind of death he would die.

Act of Spiritual Communion

My Jesus, I believe that You are present in the Most Holy Sacrament. I love You above all things and I desire to receive You into my soul. Since I cannot at this moment receive You sacramentally, come spiritually into my heart. I embrace You as if You were already there and unite myself wholly to You. Never permit me to be separated from You.
