## **GOSPEL REFLECTION:** Lord, help us to remember with gratitude our own 'resurrection' experiences.



The common theme of today's readings is the challenge to adjust our lives to the living presence of the risen Lord as we grow daily, more aware of the presence of His Holy Spirit within us and surrounding us. Our daily lives are meant to serve as a means for us to experience and share the risen Lord with others. Just as the disciples experienced the risen Lord in their community, let us learn to recognize the presence of Jesus in our own homes, social service canters, nursing facilities, hospitals, workplaces, and schools. Jesus wants us to be a community

which shares and cares, a community which knows how to recognize Jesus in the poor, the marginalized, the sick – that is, in everyone. **Prayer:** *Lord*, help us to remember with gratitude our own resurrection experiences: When someone we love was critically ill and he or she got recovered. Help us to remember when failure left us down-hearted, when our self-confidence was destroyed and gradually, we got it back by your grace.

Help us to remember when we felt overwhelmed by the challenges of life and you picked us up, help us to remember when we hurt someone dear to us and we thought we could never be friends again, but we were forgiven, and it was as if nothing had ever come between us. Help us to remember when we spent years in addiction bondage to drink or drugs, self-pity, discouragement, or pain. We thought we could never get out of it. Then someone came along and by your grace, we were restored to healthy living. Help us to remember with gratitude when We thought at first, we were seeing a ghost like the disciples in the gospel today and we were agitated and felt doubts rising in our hearts. Hesitantly we were able to touch and see for ourselves your love. Thank you for our own resurrection stories. May we always remember your resurrection daily in our lives. Amen.

# **READINGS FOR** SUNDAY 14TH **APRIL 2024**

#### **First reading**

Acts 3:13-15,17-19

You killed the prince of life: God, however, raised him from the dead

Peter said to the people: 'You are Israelites, and it is the God of Abraham, Isaac and Jacob, the God of our ancestors, who has glorified his servant Jesus, the same Jesus you handed over and then disowned in the presence of Pilate after Pilate had decided to release him. It was you who accused the Holy One, the Just One, you who demanded the reprieve of a murderer while you killed the prince of life. God, however, raised him from the dead, and to that fact we are the witnesses.

'Now I know, brothers, that neither you nor your leaders had any idea what you were really doing; this was the way God carried out what he had foretold, when he said through all his prophets that his Christ would suffer. Now you must repent and turn to God, so that your sins may be wiped out.'

### Gospel

Luke 24:35-48

It is written that the Christ would suffer and on the third day rise from the dead

The disciples told their story of what had happened on the road and how they had recognised Jesus at the breaking of bread.

They were still talking about all this when Jesus himself stood among them and said to them, 'Peace be with you!' In a state of alarm and fright, they thought they were seeing a ghost. But he said, 'Why are you so agitated, and why are these doubts rising in your hearts? Look at my hands and feet; yes, it is I indeed. Touch me and see for yourselves; a ghost has no flesh and bones as you can see I have.' And as he said this he showed them his hands and feet. Their joy was so great that they still could not believe it, and they stood there dumbfounded; so he said to them, 'Have you anything here to eat?' And they offered him a piece of grilled fish, which he took and ate before their eyes. Then he told them, 'This is what I meant when I said, while I was still with you, that everything written about me in the Law of Moses, in the Prophets and in the Psalms has to be fulfilled.' He then opened their minds to understand the scriptures, and he said to them, 'So you see how it is written that the Christ would suffer and on the third day rise from the dead, and that, in his name, repentance for the forgiveness of sins would be preached to all the nations, beginning from Jerusalem. You are witnesses to this.'

#### Act of Spiritual Communion

My Jesus, I believe that You are present in the Most Holy Sacrament. I love You above all things and I desire to receive You into my soul. Since I cannot at this moment receive You sacramentally, come spiritually into my heart. I embrace You as if You were already there and unite myself wholly to You. Never permit me to be separated from You.
