GOOD SHEPHERD SUNDAY WORLD DAY OF PRAYER FOR VOCATIONS

2nd Collection for Priest Training Fund



Every year, we celebrate the fourth Sunday of Easter as the Good Shepherd Sunday. We continue to reflect on the meaning of the Resurrection of Jesus as the most important event for us as Christians. It is also celebrated as the *World Day of Prayer for Vocations*. We celebrate the risen Lord as the Good Shepherd who lays down his life for us as part of the sheepfold.

For us at the Parish of the Good Shepherd, the good shepherd Sunday has a special meaning for us. It is an opportunity for us to look at our mission which flows from our motto: "Growing together in love", and to pray for the grace to truly live up to our motto; and to keep making efforts to grow truly and together in Love. The Gospel text offers us both comfort and challenge: the Good Shepherd knows us, provides for us, and loves us, but he also challenges us to become *good shepherds* to those entrusted to our care and *good sheep* in our parish, the sheepfold of Jesus the Good Shepherd.

Everyone who is entrusted with the care of others is a shepherd. Hence Bishops, pastors, parents, teachers, doctors, nurses, government officials, bosses, and politicians are all shepherds. We become good shepherds by loving those entrusted to us, praying for them, spending our time, talents, health, and wealth for their welfare, and guarding them from physical and spiritual dangers. Parents must be especially careful of their duties as shepherds, becoming role models for their children by leading exemplary lives. We become also a good sheep by hearing and following the voice of our shepherds through the homilies, Bible classes, counselling and advice; active participation in the Holy Mass and by frequenting the sacraments, prayer services, renewal programs, and missions. We become a good sheep by cooperating with our priests and deacons, giving them positive suggestions for the welfare of the parish, encouraging them in their ministry by prayer and presence.

On this World Day of Prayer for Vocations we are asked to encourage and pray for our young men and women to respond to God's call to serve His Church in the ministerial priesthood and consecrated life; and for all of us that we may live out our vocations as He wills. Amen.

READINGS FOR SUNDAY 21ST APRIL 2024

First reading Acts 4:8-12

The name of Jesus Christ is the only name in which we can be saved

Filled with the Holy Spirit, Peter said: 'Rulers of the people, and elders! If you are questioning us today about an act of kindness to a cripple, and asking us how he was healed, then I am glad to tell you all, and would indeed be glad to tell the whole people of Israel, that it was by the name of Jesus Christ the Nazarene, the one you crucified, whom God raised from the dead, by this name and by no other that this man is able to stand up perfectly healthy, here in your presence, today. This is the stone rejected by you the builders, but which has proved to be the keystone. For of all the names in the world given to men, this is the only one by which we can be saved.'

Responsorial Psalm Psalm 117(118):1,8-9,21-23,26,28-29 The stone which the builders rejected has become the corner stone.

Second reading 1 John 3:1-2

We shall see God because as he really is. Think of the love that the Father has lavished on us, by letting us be called God's children; and that is what we are. Because the world refused to acknowledge him, therefore it does not acknowledge us. My dear people, we are already the children of God but what we are to be in the future has not yet been revealed; all we know is, that when it is revealed we shall be like him because we shall see him as he really is

Gospel Acclamation

Alleluia, alleluia! I am the good shepherd, says the Lord; I know my own sheep and my own know me. Alleluia!

Jn10:14

Gospel John 10:11-18

The good shepherd is one who lays down his life for his sheep

Jesus said:

'I am the good shepherd: the good shepherd is one who lavs down his life for his sheep. The hired man, since he is not the shepherd and the sheep do not belong to him, abandons the sheep and runs away as soon as he sees a wolf coming, and then the wolf attacks and scatters the sheep; this is because he is only a hired man and has no concern for the sheep. 'I am the good shepherd; I know my own and my own know me, just as the Father knows me and I know the Father; and I lay down my life for my sheep. And there are other sheep I have that are not of this fold, and these I have to lead as well. They too will listen to my voice, and there will be only one flock, and one shepherd. 'The Father loves me, because I lay down my life in order to take it up again. No one takes it from me; I lay it down of my own free will, and as it is in my power to lay it down, so it is in my power to take it up again; and this is the command I have been given by my Father.'

Act of Spiritual Communion

My Jesus, I believe that You are present in the Most Holy Sacrament. I love You above all things and I desire to receive You into my soul. Since I cannot at this moment receive You sacramentally, come spiritually into my heart. I embrace You as if You were already there and unite myself wholly to You. Never permit me to be separated from You.
