GOSPEL REFLECTION: (Jn 8:1-11). From the famous story of the Woman Caught in adultery in our gospel of today, we learn about the profound message of God's boundless mercy. Pope Francis, in *Misericordia et misera* (2016), reminds us that forgiveness is the most visible sign of the Father's love, which Jesus sought to reveal through His entire life. We are called to taste and see the goodness of the Lord, which transforms and changes our lives. Like the woman in John's Gospel, we are all beneficiaries of God's abundant Mercy, (*bonum diffusivum*) hearing the words "Neither do I condemn you; go and sin no more" (Jn 8:11). We receive God's mercy and goodness and as we approach the Holy Week, let us strive to become instruments of Christ's mercy and of God's *bonum diffusivum*. Be the Mercy of God in the World; reflect that mercy through love and Forgiveness. Lord, help us to become the face of your Mercy in the world. Amen.

Philippians 3:8-14

Brothers and Sisters: I count everything as loss because of the surpassing worth of knowing Christ Jesus my Lord. For his sake I have suffered the loss of all things and count them as rubbish, in order that I may gain Christ and be found in him, not having a righteousness of my own that comes from the law, but that which comes through faith in Christ, the righteousness from God that depends on faith — that I may know him and the power of his resurrection, and may share his sufferings, becoming like him in his death, that by any means possible I may attain the resurrection from the dead.

John 8:1-11

'Let him who is without sin among you be the first to throw a stone at her.'

At that time: Jesus went to the Mount of Olives. Early in the morning he came again to the temple. All the people came to him, and he sat down and taught them. The scribes and the Pharisees brought a woman who had been caught in adultery and placing her in the midst they said to him, 'Teacher, this woman has been caught in the act of adultery. Now in the Law, Moses commanded us to stone such women. So what do you say?' This they said to test him, that they might have some charge to bring against him.
