PRIEST CORNER- HABEMUS PAPAM! On May 8, 2025, Cardinal Robert Francis Prevost was elected as the



267th pope of the Roman Catholic Church, taking the name Pope Leo XIV. This historic election marks the first time an American has ascended to the papacy. In his first public address, Pope Leo XIV emphasized themes of peace, unity, and the Love of God for the Church and for everyone. Born in Chicago in 1955, Robert Prevost is a member of the Order of Saint Augustine. He spent significant time in Peru, serving as a missionary and later as the Bishop of Chiclayo. In 2023, he was appointed by Pope Francis to lead the Vatican's Dicastery for Bishops, a role that positioned him as a key figure in the Church's hierarchy. May the Lord bless our new Pope, may he be guided by the Holy Spirit as a good shepherd.

GOOD SHEPHERD SUNDAY (WORLD DAY OF PRAYER FOR VOCATIONS) The Fourth Sunday of Easter, known as Good Shepherd Sunday, is also the "World Day of Prayer for Vocations." Each year on this Sunday, we reflect on the image of Jesus as the Good Shepherd, devotedly and kindly taking care of his flock. The title "Pastor" means shepherd. A shepherd leads, feeds, nurtures, comforts, corrects, and protects his flock. These



responsibilities belong to all Church leaders, parents, civil leaders, and all who are in charge of others. We become good shepherds by loving those entrusted to us, praying for them, spending our time and talents for their welfare, and guarding them from physical and spiritual dangers. Parents, caregivers, teachers, superiors, bosses, religious leader are called to be Good Shepherds. At home parents are the shepherds and the children are the sheep; this is the ideal situation. Parents are expected to shepherd more by good examples. Teachers are meant to teach not just by

words but also by fruitful actions. Religious leaders at various levels are meant to tend and lead the flock to God. If we anticipate good shepherds there is also need for good sheep. We are all sheep under the Good Shepherd. Just as we acknowledge our Lord Jesus Christ as the Good Shepherd, we are also expected to be good sheep. We pray for a total transformation of our lives, for Good Shepherds/Good Flock, for responsible systems/sustainable economic policies, for increase in the Priestly and Religious Vocations and for Good Marriages and responsible families. May Jesus the Good Shepherd answer our prayer, through Christ our Lord. Amen.



The Blessed Virgin Mary affirmed her blessedness when she visited her cousin sister Elizabeth in Luke 1:48: "For behold, from now on all generations will call me blessed." This verse acknowledges Mary's unique blessing and the recognition of her role in salvation. The miracle at the wedding of Cana, where Mary's request to Jesus leads to the transformation of water into wine demonstrates

Jesus's respect and willingness to listen to his mother and his mother's intercession on behalf of others -John 2:1-11.

READINGS FOR SUNDAY 11TH MAY 2025

First reading Acts 13:14, 43b-52

'Behold, we are turning to the Gentiles.' In those days: Paul and Barnabas went on from Perga and came to Antioch in Pisidia. And on the Sabbath day they went into the synagogue and sat down. Many Jews and devout converts to Judaism followed Paul and Barnabas, who, as they spoke with them, urged them to continue in the grace of God.

The next Sabbath almost the whole city gathered to hear the word of the Lord. But when the Jews saw the crowds, they were filled with jealousy and began to contradict what was spoken by Paul, reviling him. And Paul and Barnabas spoke out boldly, saying, 'It was necessary that the word of God be spoken first to you. Since you thrust it aside and judge yourselves unworthy of eternal life, behold, we are turning to the Gentiles. For so the Lord has commanded us, saying, "I have made you a light for the Gentiles, that you may bring salvation to the ends of the earth." ' And when the Gentiles heard this, they began rejoicing and glorifying the word of the Lord, and as many as were appointed to eternal life believed. And the word of the Lord was spreading throughout the whole region. But the Jews incited the devout women of high standing and the leading men of the city, stirred up persecution against Paul and Barnabas, and drove them out of their district. But they shook off the dust from their feet against them and went to Iconium. And the disciples were filled with joy and with the Holy Spirit.

Then one of the elders addressed me, saying, 'These are the ones coming out of the great tribulation. They have washed their robes and made them white in the blood of the Lamb. Therefore they are before the throne of God, and serve him day and night in his temple; and he who sits on the throne will shelter them with his presence. They shall hunger no more, neither thirst any more; the sun shall not strike them, nor any scorching heat. For the Lamb in the midst of the throne will be their shepherd, and he will guide them to springs of living water, and God will wipe away every tear from their eyes.'
