#### GOSPEL REFLECTION: THE NEW COMMANDMENT- LOVE. (Jn 13:31-33a, 34-35)

"Little children love one another:" St. Jerome relates of the apostle John that when he became old, he used to be carried

to the assembled Churches, everywhere repeating the words, "Little children, love one another." His disciples, wearied by the constant repetition, asked him why he always said this. "Because," he replied, "it is the Lord's commandment, and if it only be fulfilled, it is enough."

In today's Gospel which is part of the farewell discourse, Jesus gives his followers a *new commandment*: they must love one another as he has loved them. They would be known, not by the sign of the fish or even of the cross, but by their mutual love, the fruit of their conversion. Just as Solomon, in the story of the disputed child, was able to discern the identity of the true mother by her love, so will the world be able to identify the true disciples of Jesus by their love for one another. The command of Jesus is both new and old. It repeats the precept of the Old Testament, "You shall love your neighbour as you love yourself" (Lv 19:18). But the command of Jesus is "You shall love your neighbour as I have loved you." What is new is that this love characterizes the new life inaugurated by Jesus and is proof of one's



love for God (1 Jn. 4:7). Jesus' new commandment calls for love without limits, conditions, or prerequisites. This love opens our eyes to facts that we might otherwise overlook — that the poor in the world belong to our family; that those who live in despair may be saved by God through our care of them; that God's peace can come to the world through our efforts as we pray and work with Him.

#### **CATECHISM-** Catholic teaching on the use of statues and images in worship:

In the sixteenth and seventeenth centuries the Protestant Reformers stripped Catholic Churches of images, broke statues and stained glass. *The Catechism of the Council of Trent* (1566) taught that idolatry is committed "by worshipping idols and images as God, or believing that they possess any divinity or virtue entitling them to our worship, by praying to, or reposing confidence in them" (374). Images of Jesus, Mary and the saints have been used for decorational and devotional purposes since the beginning of Christianity. The Council of Trent explained the practice perfectly. "The images of Christ, the Virgin Mother of God, and the other saints are kept and honored in churches not because it is believed that there is any divinity or power in these images, or that anything may be asked of them or any faith put in them. The honor shown to them is really being given to the person whom they represent. Through these images which we kiss, and before which we bow with bared heads, we worship Christ and not the saints whose likeness they display." *The Catechism of the Catholic Church* (CCC), states clearly, "Idolatry is a perversion of man's innate religious sense. An idolater is someone who 'transfers his indestructible notion of God to anything other than God'" (CCC #2114). We do not worship the holy images; we keep them as a reminder of the Lord and the saints whom we love. It is like keeping the photographs of our loved one, they always remind and connect our hearts to them.

# READINGS FOR SUNDAY 18<sup>TH</sup> MAY 2025

First reading

Acts 14:21b-27

## 'They declared to the Church all that God had done with them.'

In those days: Paul and Barnabas returned to Lystra and to Iconium and to Antioch, strengthening the souls of the disciples, encouraging them to continue in the faith, and saying that through many tribulations we must enter the kingdom of God. And when they had appointed elders for them in every church, with prayer and fasting they committed them to the Lord in whom they had believed.

Then they passed through Pisidia and came to Pamphylia. And when they had spoken the word in Perga, they went down to Attalia, and from there they sailed to Antioch, where they had been commended to the grace of God for the work that they had fulfilled. And when they arrived and gathered the church together, they declared all that God had done with them, and how he had opened a door of faith to the Gentiles.
