GOSPEL REFLECTION: IS 66:18-21; HEB 12:5-7, 11-13; LK 13:22-30

Today's scripture readings are on God's invitation to all to be his people, and to enter through the narrow gate. Jesus is the door to the Father.

The first reading from Isaiah says that the time has come to gather all nations and tongues and they shall proclaim his glory. From among them he will also take priests and Levites. The responsorial Psalm calls for a worldwide proclamation of the good news of salvation. In the second reading St Paul says that God disciplines those he loves just as any good father does. All disciples have to endure this discipline because for the moment they seem painful but in the long run it yields the peaceful fruit of righteousness.



In the Gospel reading we see Jesus while making his way to Jerusalem was teaching and stopping in villages and towns. On this occasion someone asked Jesus "Lord, will those to be saved be few?" Jesus did not answer that question but took that opportunity to say that salvation would not be automatic. Salvation is like coming through a narrow door. This does not say that only a few will be saved. Rather that entering it is not determined simply by the easy way of belonging to a certain ethnic or religious group, but rather by the much more demanding way of living a responsible life of human goodness and love as Jesus himself did. He is telling us, that while salvation is indeed universal, we must not look upon it with any spirit of complacency, as if we are somehow or other more specially favoured by God. In John 10:7-9 Jesus describes himself as 'the gate of the sheepfold'. Therefore to enter through the narrow door is to learn to live like Jesus did. We must remember the example that he gives us. He accepted and carried out the father's will. Again, his life was constantly reaching out to the poor, the neglected, and the despised.

CATECHISM – Justification by Grace

Justification is by the infusion of sanctifying grace and the theological virtues (**faith**, **hope**, **and charity**), by means of which the human person becomes God's acceptable child, his loving friend, an heir of eternal life (**Jn 15:15**, **Rom 8:14-17**, **Gal 4:7**). The Catholic teaching is that forgiveness of sin is not isolated from this re-creation by sanctifying grace (**Gal 6:15**), but comes hand-in-hand with it. Hence, it is inseparable from the first form of justification as forgiveness of sin. Our Redemption is not, and cannot be, accomplished by works of law.

Isaiah 66:18-21

'They shall bring all your brothers from all the nations.'

Thus says the LORD:

Hebrews 12:5-7. 11-13

'The Lord disciplines the one he loves.'

Brothers and sisters: Have you forgotten the exhortation that addresses you as sons? 'My son, do not regard lightly the discipline of the Lord, nor be weary when reproved by him. For the Lord disciplines the one he loves, and chastises every son whom he receives.' It is for discipline that you have to endure. God is treating you as sons. For what son is there whom his father does not discipline? For the moment all discipline seems painful rather than pleasant, but later it yields the peaceful fruit of righteousness to those who have been trained by it.

Therefore lift your drooping hands and strengthen your weak knees, and make straight paths for your feet, so that what is lame may not be put out of joint but rather be healed.

Luke 12:13-21

'People will come from east and west, and recline at the table in the kingdom of God.'

At that time: Jesus went on his way through towns and villages, teaching and journeying towards Jerusalem. And someone said to him, 'Lord, will those who are saved be few?' And he said to them, 'Strive to enter through the narrow door. For many, I tell you, will seek to enter and will not be able. When once the master of the house has risen and shut the door, and you begin to stand outside and to knock at the door, saying, "Lord, open to us", then he will answer you, "I do not know where you come from." Then you will begin to say, "We ate and drank in your presence, and you taught in our streets." But he will say, "I tell you, I do not know where you come from. Depart from me, all you workers of evil!" In that place there will be weeping and gnashing of teeth, when you see Abraham and Isaac and Jacob and all the prophets in the kingdom of God but you yourselves cast out. And people will come from east and west, and from north and south, and recline at table in the kingdom of God. And behold, some are last who will be first, and some are first who will be last.'
