

Today we Celebrate World Grandparents and The Elderly Day.

GOSPEL REFLECTION: Today's Scripture warns us of the futility of the greedy acquisition of wealth and power because everything and everyone is "here today and gone tomorrow." For the meaning of life cannot be found in



selfishly hoarding wealth and possessions. The first reading from Ecclesiastes says that concern for material possessions is vanity, utter futility. In the Responsorial Psalm (Ps 90), the Psalmist challenges us to listen to God and allow Him to soften our hearts that we may share our blessings with others. In the second reading, St. Paul directs our attention to lasting, heavenly treasures and warns that greed for wealth and influence is idolatry. And in the gospel from Luke (LK 12: 13-21) Jesus, in telling the parable of the foolish rich man, warns us against all types of greed — the acquisition of material possessions; the approval and praise of others; the excessive desire for power, control, or fame; the sinful indulgence in eating, drinking, gambling, drugs, or sexual activities. Greed takes our life's focus away from God and away from serving and loving Him in Himself and in other people.

We must enter into the serious consideration to which these Scriptures call us. Are our values to be found primarily in living the so-called good life, in being comfortably well off, in having money, success, security, prosperity and an ever-

higher standard of living? Or are our values to be found primarily in bringing about the kingdom of God. May God give us the grace to realize the emptiness of earthly possessions, and the spirit of sharing our blessings with others.

CATECHISM - THE TENTH COMMANDMENT



The tenth commandment forbids *greed* and the desire to amass earthly goods without limit. It forbids *avarice* arising from a passion for riches and their attendant power. It also forbids the desire to commit injustice by harming our neighbor in his temporal goods. When the Law says, "You shall not covet," these words mean that we should banish our desires for whatever does not belong to us. Our thirst for another's goods is immense, infinite, never quenched. Thus it is written: "He who loves money never has money enough." The precept of detachment from riches is obligatory for entrance into the Kingdom of heaven.

Second Reading

Colossians 3:1-5, 9-11

'Seek the things that are above, where Christ is.'

Brothers and sisters: If you have been raised with Christ, seek the things that are above, where Christ is, seated at the right hand of God. Set your minds on things that are above, not on things that are on earth. For you have died, and your life is hidden with Christ in God. When Christ who is your life appears, then you also will appear with him in glory. Put to death, therefore, what is earthly in you: sexual immorality, impurity, passion, evil desire, and covetousness, which is idolatry. Do not lie to one another, seeing that you have put off the old self with its practices and have put on the new self, which is being renewed in knowledge after the image of its creator. Here there is not Greek and Jew, circumcised and uncircumcised, barbarian, Scythian, slave, free; but Christ is all, and in all.

Luke 12:13-21

'The things you have prepared, whose will they be'

At that time: Someone in the crowd said to Jesus, 'Teacher, tell my brother to divide the inheritance with me.' But he said to him, 'Man, who made me a judge or arbitrator over you?' And he said to them, 'Take care, and be on your guard against all covetousness, for one's life does not consist in the abundance of one's possessions.' And he told them a parable, saying, 'The land of a rich man produced plentifully, and he thought to himself, "What shall I do, for I have nowhere to store my crops?" And he said, "I will do this: I will tear down my barns and build larger ones, and there I will store all my grain and my goods. And I will say to my soul, 'Soul, you have ample goods laid up for many years; relax, eat, drink, be merry." But God said to him, "Fool! This night your soul is required of you, and the things you have prepared, whose will they be?" So is the one who lays up treasure for himself, and is not rich towards God.'

Act of Spiritual Communion
