GOSPEL REFLECTION: BE FAITHFUL IN LITTLE THINGS: LK 16:1-13.

In the first reading for today, Amos, the Prophet of social Justice, condemns the crooked business practices of the 8th century BC Jewish merchants of Judea, and reminds the Israelites, and us, to be faithful to our Covenant with Yahweh



by practicing justice and mercy as God's faithful stewards. He warns us also against making the goal of our life the gaining money by any means. In today's Responsorial Psalm (Ps 113), the Psalmist reminds us that the Allseeing God protects and cares for the poor, singing, "Who is like the Lord, our God, Who is enthroned on high / and looks upon the Heavens and the earth below? / He raises up the lowly from the dust; from the dunghill He lifts up the poor/ to seat them with princes, with the princes of His own people" (vv 5-8). In the second reading, St. Paul instructs the first century Judeo-Christians to become true stewards of the Gospel of Jesus, the only Mediator

between God and man, by preaching the "Good News" to pagans and including them in intercessory prayers as well. Today's Gospel story tells us about a crooked, but resourceful, manager and challenges us to use our blessings time, talents, health, and wealth – wisely and justly so that they will serve us for our good, in eternity. We use our earthly wealth wisely when we spend it for our own needs in moderation and when we love and help the needy around us, because these are the purposes for which God has entrusted His blessings to us.

We need to be faithful in little things of life: Often we get so caught up in our work that we ignore the little things of life. But let us not ignore these little matters; things like dropping someone an encouraging note or extending people a simple, "Thank you." Similarly, we ought to take time out of our workday to help others in small things. As Saint John Chrysostom said, "Faithfulness in little things is a big thing." We may not be able to reach millions of people all over the world but in our own part of the world, we can faithfully do little things to point people toward Jesus. Our future opportunities in the eternal service of God largely depend on our stewardship in handling the little opportunities we have had on earth. As St. Teresa of Calcutta teaches us, "Do little things with great love."

EVANGELII GAUDIUM FOR C.A.S.E: There will be a second collection next **Sunday**, **28**th **September** for the Evangelii Gaudium (Home Mission) - the **Catholic Agency for the Support of Evangelization** - this collection provides the bishops of England and Wales with resources to support Home Mission, the spread of the gospel in our own country. CATECHISM ON CONFESSION

How to go to confession. One. Pray and examine your conscience. Take time to reflect on your thoughts, words, and

actions. Pray for God's guidance to make a sincere confession. Use a guide to learn how to examine your conscience. **Two.** Kneel and say, "Forgive me, Father, for I have sinned," and state how long it has been since your last confession, weeks, months, or years. **Three**. Sincerely confess all your sins and how often you committed them.

If unsure, estimate. Avoid vague terms like "several times." **Four.** Conclude with, "I am sorry for these sins and those I cannot remember. I ask for your pardon and peace." **Five.** Listen to the priest's advice and penance. **Six.** Say the Act of Contrition. **Seven.** Receive absolution, return to your seat, and do your penance. **Eight.** Pray and thank God for the grace of confession and go in peace and joy.



Biblical Foundations

John 20:22–23 – Jesus gives the Apostles power to forgive sins. James 5:16 – "Confess your sins to one another." Luke 15 – Parables of mercy: the lost sheep, coin, and prodigal son.

How Often Should Catholics Confess?

The Church requires confession at least once a year (Canon Law 989). Regular confession (monthly or more often) is strongly recommended, even for venial sins. Many saints advised frequent confession as a means of growing in holiness.

First Reading Amos 8:4-7

'Against those who 'buy the poor for silver'

Hear this, you who trample upon the needy and bring the poor of the land to an end, saying, 'When will the new moon be over, that we may sell grain? And the Sabbath, that we may offer wheat for sale, that we may make the ephah small and the shekel great and deal deceitfully with false balances that we may buy the poor for silver, and the needy for a pair of sandals, and sell the chaff of the wheat?' The Lord has sworn by the pride of Jacob: 'Surely I will never forget any of their deeds.'

Second Reading

1 Timothy 2:1-8

Prayers should be made for all people to God, who desires all people to be saved.

Beloved: First of all, I urge that supplications, prayers, intercessions, and thanksgiving be made for all people for kings and all who are in high positions, that we may lead a peaceful and quiet life, godly and dignified in every way. This is good, and it is pleasing in the sight of God our Saviour, who desires all people to be saved and to come to the knowledge of the truth. For there is one God, and there is one mediator between Good and men, the man Christ Jesus, who gave himself as a ransom for all, which is the testimony given at the proper time.]For this I was appointed a preacher and an Apostle – I am telling the truth, I am not lying – a teacher of the Gentiles in faith and truth. I desire then that in every place the men should pray, lifting, holy hands without anger or quarrelling.

Gospel

Luke 16:1-13

'You cannot serve God and money.'

At that time: Jesus said to the disciples, 'There was a rich man who had a manager, and charges were brought to him that this man was wasting his possessions. And he called him and said to him, "What is this that I hear about you? Turn in the account of your management, for you can no longer be manager." And the manager said to himself, "What shall I do, since my master is taking the management away from me? I am not strong enough to dig, and I am ashamed to beg. I have decided what to do, so that when I am removed from management, people may receive me into their houses." So, summoning his master's one by one, he said to the first, "How much do you owe my master?" He said, "A hundred measures of oil." He said to him, "Take your bill, and sit down quickly and write fifty." Then he said to another, "And how much do you owe?' He said, "A hundred measures of wheat." He said to him, "Take your bill and write eighty." The master commended the dishonest manager for his shrewdness. For the sons of this world are more shrewd in dealing with their own generation than the sons of light.' And I tell you, make friends for yourselves by means of unrighteous wealth, so that when it fails they may receive you into the eternal dwellings.

'One who is faithful in a very little is also faithful in much, and one who is dishonest in a very little is also dishonest in much. If then you have not been faithful with the unrighteous wealth, who will entrust to you the true riches? And if you have not been faithful with that which is another's, who will give you that which is your own? No servant can serve two masters; for either he will hate the one and love the other, or he will be devoted to the one and despise the other. You cannot serve God and money.'

Act of Spiritual Communion

My Jesus, I believe that You are present in the Most Holy Sacrament. I love You above all things and I desire to receive You into my soul. Since I cannot at this moment receive You sacramentally, come spiritually into my heart. I embrace You as if You were already there and unite myself wholly to You. Never permit me to be separated from You.
