GOSPEL REFLECTION: GRATITUDE TO GOD: Today's Gospel story tells us of a single non-Jewish leper (a "Samaritan"), who returned to thank Jesus for healing him, while the other nine now-healed Jewish lepers went their way. Perhaps, they were under the false impression that healing was their right as God's "chosen"



people," so, they hurried off to obtain health certificates from the priests. "Where are the other nine?" Jesus asked (rhetorically) of the returned Samaritan and the crowd. Today's readings also remind us that Faith and healing go hand in hand. It was Faith that prompted Naaman to plunge himself into the waters of the Jordan River, and it was Faith in Jesus which prompted the lepers to present themselves first to Jesus and then to the priests. The readings also demonstrate the universal love of God for all peoples, including the Samaritans (whom the Israelites hated), and the pagans, Israel's enemies, whom Naaman represented. We need to learn to be thankful to God and to others. We can express our gratitude to our loving God in so many ways; by the simple act of offering grace before meals and by allotting a few minutes of the

day for private or family prayer. Let us show our gratitude to our forgiving God by forgiving others and by loving God in them, radiating His love, mercy, and compassion to all we encounter, including our families and friends. Let us have an "attitude of gratitude" to God and to our neighbors, let us celebrate the Holy Eucharist as the supreme act of thanksgiving. As St. Paul admonishes us, 'in all things, give thanks'.

STOP ASSISTED SUICIDE - FURTHER ACTION NEEDED! At Second Reading of the Leadbeater assisted suicide Bill in the House of Lords, a record number of Peers spoke. Of those who took a position, around two-thirds opposed the assisted suicide Bill. That is more than double the number who supported it. This momentum has been built by tens of thousands of people writing to Peers in opposition. While the fight isn't over, with your support we can defeat this Bill. To do so, we will need to keep sending letters to oppose the Leadbeater assisted suicide Bill. CATECHISM – IN ALL THINGS, GIVE THANKS.

"No duty is more urgent than that of returning thanks." - St. Ambrose. Ten cried out to Jesus, but only one came back to thank him. Ten were healed, but only one was saved. Ten got something temporal, but only one got something eternal. One of the things that this story highlights is the incredible ingratitude that nine people had for what Jesus did for them. They were very ungrateful because they didn't even take the time to go back and thank him. Do we thank God as much as we ask God for something? Do we give to God the glory He deserves whenever we get from God what we don't deserve? The Bible says in 1 Thessalonians 5:18, "Give thanks in all circumstances for this is God's will for you in Christ Jesus." We thank God for who He is, not based on the results, not how He answered or when He answered or whether He answered the way we wanted Him to answer. We thank God because, He's worthy of our praise, and we give Him glory no matter what because that's God's will for us in Christ Jesus. Catholics have the Habit of requesting for the Holy Mass for those they love or for Special intentions and especially to express gratitude for blessings received.

When he saw them he said to them, 'Go and show yourselves to the priests.' And as they went they were cleansed. Then one of them, when he saw that he was healed, turned back, praising God with a loud voice; and he fell on his face at Jesus' feet, giving him thanks. Now he was a Samaritan. Then Jesus answered, 'Were not ten cleansed? Where are the nine? Was no one found to return and give praise to God except this foreigner?' And he said to him, 'Rise and go your way; your faith has made you well.'
