MISSION SUNDAY: Over one billion Catholics all over the world observe today as World Mission Sunday. Pope Leo XIV's message for the 2025 World Mission Sunday emphasizes the theme "Missionaries of Hope Among all Peoples," encouraging Christians to be messengers and builders of hope in the Jubilee Year 2025. He asks the faithful to burn with holy zeal for a new era of evangelization, bringing hope to a world overshadowed by dark shadows, and to be a community of hope by letting the Spirit guide their actions. GOSPEL REFLECTION: PERSISTENCE IN PRAYER: The Church is "missionary" in her very nature because her founder, Jesus Christ, was the first missionary. God the Father sent God the Son, Incarnate in Jesus, His Christ, into the world with a message of God's love and salvation. Thus, the evangelizing mission of the Church



is essentially the announcement of God's love, mercy, forgiveness, and salvation, as these are revealed to mankind through the life, death, and Resurrection of Jesus Christ our Lord. How should we evangelize? There are many ways: 1) By living an exemplary and transparent Christian life, 2) by prayer, and 3) by financial support. The first and most powerful means of preaching Christ is by living a truly Christian life. Prayer is also the dominant theme of our Scripture readings today. In today's gospel

reading, Jesus encourages his disciples to persevere in prayer and not lose heart. When we bring our needs and the needs of others to our heavenly Father, we are responding to the explicit instruction of Jesus: 'Ask and it will be given you; seek and you will find; knock and it will be opened to you' (Lk 11:9).

REPORT ON PARISH PROJECTS: Some time ago, I shared to you the list of Parish projects. I want to thank all those who have quietly supported the many projects with generous donations. I am amazed at the level of your dedication and generosity, may the Lord bless and reward you all. Thank you all. At St. Paul's, the new glass door is completed and it cost about £7,500; Clearing the Garden cost about £2,500, a shed for the Garden cost over £3,000 (Thanks to the partial grant of the Diocese and some donors for this). The Projector Project at St. Paul's will cost about £12,000; (Thanks to the donation of £7000 already by some Parishioners; thank you so much). The big work ahead at St. Paul's will be the Presbytery Kitchen and the Parish Hall. At St. Finbarr's: The felling of trees which we have been working on has cost us about £9,000; (Sounds too much! but as I am writing this today, the insurance company is demanding that we remove more trees, otherwise they will not renew our insurance and for them to just do that survey alone last week, it cost £1,400. The reconstruction of the disabled ramp is costing about £11,500, the new Projector already completed cost about £5,000; the planning permit to improve the façade of the Church is costing us £4,000, and the actual quote to do the work is about £7,500. I just write these lines so that you may know, and to thank all who are silently donating to support our Parish projects. I am appealing to the good people of St. Finbarr's; I need your donations and support to improve St. Finbarr's. I have not received much response so far. Let's build our Church together, support and make your Church come alive. Thank you. Fr. Leo

'Whenever Moses held up his hand, Isreal prevailed'

In those days: Amalek came and fought with Israel at Rephidim. So Moses said to Joshua, 'Choose for us men, and go out and fight with Amalek. Tomorrow I will stand on the top of the hill with the staff of God in my hand.' So Joshua did as Moses told him, and fought with Amalek, while Moses, Aaron, and Hur went up to the top of the hill. Luke 18:1 -8

'God will give justice to his elect, who cry to him.'

At that time: Jesus told his disciples a parable to the effect that they ought always to pray and not lose heart. He said, 'In a certain city there was a judge who neither feared God nor respected man. And there was a widow in that city who kept coming to him and saying, "Give me justice against my adversary." For a while he refused, but afterwards he said to himself, "Though I neither fear God nor respect man, yet because this widow keeps bothering me, I will give her justice, so that she will not beat me down by her continual coming."

And the Lord said, 'Hear what the unrighteous judge says. And will not God give justice to his elect, who cry to him day and night? Will he delay long over them? I tell you, he will give justice to them speedily. Nevertheless, when the Son of Man comes, will he find faith on earth?'
