GOSPEL REFLECTION: CHRIST THE KING

The feast we are celebrating today is a feast that was attested to by the three wise men who came to see Jesus after his birth. When they got into king Herod's palace, they requested for the place where the new king was born. Though the thought of both Herod and his people were that a new king who may replace him has been born unknown to him. But in fact, Jesus was not the type of king that they were thinking. Paul in the second reading explained the nature of the kingship of Jesus which is aimed at delivering believers from the kingdom of darkness into the kingdom of light. This kingdom is a place where believers are redeemed and sins forgiven and above all, every believer is firstborn as God has no favorite. So, Paul did not deny the existence of other kingdoms but invites us to be part of this new kingdom of Jesus. Jesus reassured us of membership of his kingdom if we accept him irrespective of what we have done in the past. He exemplified admission process into his kingdom when a repentant sinner asked for a place in his kingdom and Jesus promised him a place in the paradise. The kingdom of



Jesus is that of love and peace and to all who accept him are the representative of his kingdom here on earth. May we continue to reconcile ourselves to the mercy of Jesus and continue to celebrate his kingship in the world.
