GOSPEL REFLECTION: FOURTH SUNDAY OF ADVENT YEAR A. The promise made by God through the prophesy of Isaiah that a Savior of the world will be born became a reality when the Angel Gabriel visited Mary and she accepted the will of God in her life. Again, the message that the Savior will come through the line of David became possible through Joseph who accepted to keep Mary as his wife even when circumstances surrounding her pregnancy was not clear to him. The humility of Joseph was so significant in the whole of God's plan for the world. He wanted to send Mary away without disgracing her publicly after hearing Mary's side of the story which was a little bit difficult to understand and accept with the limited human mind. Joseph by paying attention to the Angel who spoke to him in a dream, he gave up his plan and took Mary as his wife. Even though the angel referred to the prophesy of Isaiah regarding the pregnancy which Joseph may know, that doesn't make it any easier for him to digest and accept. This is where faith and trust in God played significant role in his final decision to take Mary into his home. Is it possible for us to learn a lesson from the noble plan Joseph had before the Angel revealed to him his role in salvific story? He chose not to disgrace Mary. Sometimes we want to see the person who seemingly betrayed us go down and disgraced. Joseph took a noble path of not hurting back. This time of Christmas is an opportunity for us to redress our thoughts about others and seek reconciliation. The Angel may as well tell us something about that frightening decision of forgiving and letting go those who hurt us which may affect our joys at this time.

Jesus was born of Mary, who was betrothed to Joseph, son of David.

Now the birth of Jesus Christ took place in this way. When his mother Mary had been betrothed to Joseph, before they came together she was found to be with child from the Holy Spirit. And her husband Joseph, being a just man and unwilling to put her to shame, resolved to send her away quietly. But as he considered these things, behold, an angel of the Lord appeared to him in a dream, saying, 'Joseph, son of David, do not fear to take Mary as your wife, for that which is conceived in her is from the Holy Spirit. She will bear a son, and you shall call his name Jesus, for he will save his people from their sins.'

All this took place to fulfil what the Lord had spoken by the prophet:

'Behold, the virgin shall conceive and bear a son, and they shall call his name Emmanuel' — which means, God with us.

When Joseph woke from sleep, he did as the angel of the Lord commanded him: he took his wife.
