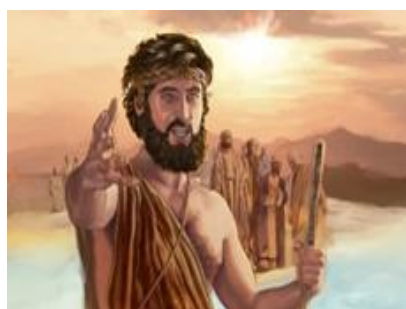

### GOSPEL REFLECTION: SECOND SUNDAY OF ADVENT YEAR A.



The mission of Jesus Christ was foretold in days of old through the prophets and the preparation for his coming was emphasized by John the Baptist. Prophet Isaiah was explaining the vision of what will happen with the coming of the Messiah. His coming will bear fruit of kindness which will transform the situations of the poor. It will be the dawning of peace as wolf and lamb will live together in peace, calf and lion will feed together and there will be no more danger as children of God will live in freedom and peace. His reign will bring joy and peace. All these beautiful prophesies are for us and to gain it, we need prepare and be ready to embrace the new ways

of life that Jesus brings to us. Preparing to meet Jesus at Christmas requires checking that we meet the conditions that will help us achieve his mission. John the Baptist gave us two of the conditions that are important which will help us to meet the requirements for encountering Jesus and making his mission realized. He invites us to a life of repentance and of making the way for the Lord to be straight which is referring to our hearts. The psalmist says, "In his days shall justice flourish, and great peace forever". All these are possible with our relationships with one another. When we chose peace, love and forgiveness then we are already experiencing his days of justice and peace. The fulfilment of the prophesy of Isaiah starts with each one of us as we prepare to receive the prince of peace.

**CATECHISM: Key Catholic Family Practices for Advent:** Advent is a great time of beauty in **Catholic families**. We have some traditional practices around the **Advent Wreath**. The advent wreath is a visible sign; a circular wreath of evergreen (symbolizing God's eternal love); Four candles: **three purple, one pink**; One candle is lit each Sunday of Advent, with prayers and sometimes hymns. The **third Sunday, Gaudete Sunday**, uses the pink candle as a sign of joyful anticipation. Families often pray together as they light the candle each week. Catholic Families are encouraged to read the scripture and pray the family evening time around the wreath. **The Advent Calendar is also another** joyful way for families, especially with children to mark the countdown to Christmas. Encourage all the members of the family to also receive and celebrate the sacrament of reconciliation as a great way of preparation. Remember that the Nativity scene is set up early in Advent, but the **baby Jesus is not placed in the manger until Christmas Eve**.

# Readings for Sunday

## 7<sup>th</sup> December 2025

### First Reading

Isaiah 11:1-10

*'With righteousness he shall judge the poor.'*

On that day: There shall come forth a shoot from the stump of Jesse, and a branch from his roots shall bear fruit. And the Spirit of the LORD shall rest upon him, the Spirit of wisdom and understanding, the Spirit of counsel and might, the Spirit of knowledge and the fear of the LORD. And his delight shall be in the fear of the LORD. He shall not judge by what his eyes see, or decide disputes by what his ears hear, but with righteousness he shall judge the poor, and decide with equity for the meek of the earth; and he shall strike the earth with the rod of his mouth, and with the breath of his lips he shall kill the wicked. Righteousness shall be the belt of his waist, and faithfulness the belt of his loins.

The wolf shall dwell with the lamb, and the leopard shall lie down with the young goat, and the calf and the lion and the fattened calf together; and a little child shall lead them. The cow and the bear shall graze; their young shall lie down together; and the lion shall eat straw like the ox. The nursing child shall play over the hole of the cobra, and the weaned child shall put his hand on the adder's den. They shall not hurt or destroy in all my holy mountain; for the earth shall be full of the knowledge of the LORD as the waters cover the sea.

In that day the root of Jesse, who shall stand as a signal for the peoples — of him shall the nations enquire, and his resting-place shall be glorious.

May the God of endurance and encouragement grant you to live in such harmony with one another, in accord with Christ Jesus, that together you may with one voice glorify the God and Father of our Lord Jesus Christ. Therefore welcome one another as Christ has welcomed you, for the glory of God.

For I tell you that Christ became a servant to the circumcised to show God's truthfulness, in order to confirm the promises given to the patriarchs, and in order that the Gentiles might glorify God for his mercy. As it is written, 'Therefore I will praise you among the Gentiles, and sing to your name.'

### Gospel

**Luke 21:5-19**

*'Repent, for the kingdom of heaven is at hand.'*

In those days John the Baptist came preaching in the wilderness of Judea, 'Repent, for the kingdom of heaven is at hand.' For this is he who was spoken of by the prophet Isaiah when he said, 'The voice of one crying in the wilderness: "Prepare the way of the Lord; make his paths straight."'

Now John wore a garment of camel's hair and a leather belt round his waist, and his food was locusts and wild honey. Then Jerusalem and all Judea and all the region about the Jordan were going out to him, and they were baptised by him in the river Jordan, confessing their sins. But when he saw many of the Pharisees and Sadducees coming to his baptism, he said to them, 'You brood of vipers! Who warned you to flee from the wrath to come? Bear fruit in keeping with repentance. And do not presume to say to yourselves, "We have Abraham as our father", for I tell you, God is able from these stones to raise up children for Abraham. Even now the axe is laid to the root of the trees. Every tree therefore that does not bear good fruit is cut down and thrown into the fire.

'I baptise you with water for repentance, but he who is coming after me is mightier than I, whose sandals I am not worthy to carry. He will baptise you with the Holy Spirit and fire. His winnowing fork is in his hand, and he will clear his threshing floor and gather his wheat into the barn, but the chaff he will burn with unquenchable fire.'

### Act of Spiritual Communion

**My Jesus, I believe that You are present in the Most Holy Sacrament. I love You above all things and I desire to receive You into my soul. Since I cannot at this moment receive You sacramentally, come spiritually into my heart. I embrace You as if You were already there and unite myself wholly to You.
