GOSPEL REFLECTION:



A primary school teacher whose classes were always the best in the school was once asked about her technique that makes her class children to perform so well. She responded, "I always become one with my class children by using the same type of chair as they, eating what they eat with them during meal and playing with them during break". This by no means indicates that the teacher and the children are of the same level but in so doing the children gained the trust of the teacher. Jesus in the gospel of today came to John for baptism. Not because he needed the baptism but to teach us by example what we need to do to become adopted sons and daughters of God. After his baptism, the voice of the Father confirmed him to be his beloved son, and the Holy Spirit bore witness to that. The baptism became another manifestation of Jesus to the world. It was after his baptism that Jesus' ministry started. In

the same way, once we are baptized, God confirms us to be his sons or daughters and we then receive the Holy Spirit that empowers and sends us into the world to continue the ministry of Jesus.

CATECHISM



What is baptism and what effect does it have on a person?

Baptism is the sacrament that gives our souls the new life of sanctifying grace by which we become children of God and heirs of heaven. Our adoption as sons of God through sanctifying grace is more perfect than human adoption whereby children are adopted by foster parents. In human adoption nothing is given to the foster son that makes him similar to the foster parent. Into the souls of the adopted sons of God, however, sanctifying grace is infused, which gives them supernaturally a likeness to God. (Baltimore catechism)

"All power in heaven and on earth has been given to me. Go, therefore, and make disciples of all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit, teaching them to observe all that I have commanded you; and behold, I am with you all days, even unto the consummation of the world" (Matthew 28:18-20). If you, your child or grandchild is not baptised and you have interest in baptism, please speak to the priest.

Isaiah 42:1-4, 6-7

‘Behold my servant, in whom my soul delights.’

Thus says the LORD:

Matthew 3:13-17

‘When Jesus was baptised he saw the Spirit of God coming to rest on him.’

At that time: Jesus came from Galilee to the Jordan to John, to be baptised by him. John would have prevented him, saying, ‘I need to be baptised by you, and do you come to me?’ But Jesus answered him, ‘Let it be so now, for thus it is fitting for us to fulfil all righteousness.’ Then he consented. And when Jesus was baptised, immediately he went up from the water, and behold, the heavens were opened to him, and he saw the Spirit of God descending like a dove and coming to rest on him; and behold, a voice from heaven said, ‘This is my beloved Son, with whom I am well pleased.’

Act of Spiritual Communion
