GOSPEL REFLECTION:

In the gospel of today, Jesus gave us a rule of life that will give us both inner peace and assurance of eternal life.

The whole of the beatitude points us toward eternal happiness and fulfilment which can only be achieved in heaven where we shall see the beauty of God. In the teaching of the beatitude, Jesus draws us closer to God through our experiences and choices we make in our daily life encounters. In it we not only gain peace of heart that the world cannot give but also secure a place with God in heaven. All the principles of the beatitude evoke some actions which may not be so easy for the flesh but brings inner peace when we chose to follow them. Because it is



not an easy way of life, Paul reminds us that when we were called that we may not be wise or powerful in the worldly standard of judgement but that he called what is weak, foolish and low, to show the wisdom of God to the world. Following Jesus means accepting and keeping his command which to the world may sound weak or foolish but to those who accept, it becomes a way that leads to life.
