**PRIEST'S CORNER:** Every year we begin the period of Lent with Ash Wednesday which calls to mind the importance of humility and reconciliation with God who loves us unconditionally. It is a time when we reflect



about our life, pray more, give more to the poor and practice fasting. Reflecting on our life helps us see where we are in our spiritual life. If we are making progress, then we keep trying and if we are not measuring up then we ask God to rekindle our efforts. The sacrament of reconciliation helps us in realigning our spiritual life. Prayer is the fuel that keeps our spiritual life moving. Jesus often finds time to pray and taught his apostles the importance of prayer. During Lent, adoration can be one of the ways we can reconnect with God by

spending time with the blessed Sacrament and private prayers. Whatever you do to the least of my brothers you do unto me. These were the words of Jesus in Matthew 25:40. This period gives us the opportunity to give to Jesus through the poor. In fasting we increase our spiritual strength. We can fast and abstain in so many ways. As we start the period of Lent on Ash Wednesday, let us keep in mind that it is a time we journey with Jesus on the way to Calvary for us to join in celebrating his resurrection. I invite you on this journey of Lent.

**GOSPEL REFLECTION:** A little girl had two apples and the mother asked for one. The little child had a taste from each of the apples and then gave the mother one of the two. The mother asked why she nibbled the two before giving her one and the child replied, I want to give you the sweetest one. In the same way we are always faced with options, from where we make choices which could be negative or positive. Inaction in the face of certain situations is also a form of choice. God has given us free will to make choices hence the book of Sirach reminds us that whatever choice we make has a consequence and that God never pushes us into any of the choices. Jesus goes further to emphasise the importance of being conscious and avoiding situations that may lead us into wrong choices. Actions such as forgiving others when they offend us or acknowledging when we offend and ask for forgiveness are all healthy choices that bring us closer to God. Conscious of good choices will lead us into maintaining honesty and integrity in face of all situations by saying yes when it is yes and no when it is no without fear as Jesus taught us.

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### Gospel

Matthew 5:17-37

*'You are the light of the world.'*

At that time: Jesus said to his disciples, 'Do not think that I have come to abolish the Law or the Prophets; I have not come to abolish them but to fulfil them. For truly, I say to you, until heaven and earth pass away, not an iota, not a dot, will pass from the Law until all is accomplished. Therefore whoever relaxes one of the least of these commandments and teaches others to do the same will be called least in the kingdom of heaven, but whoever does them and teaches them will be called great in the kingdom of heaven. For I tell you, unless your righteousness exceeds that of the scribes and Pharisees, you will never enter the kingdom of heaven.'

'You have heard that it was said to those of old, "You shall not murder; and whoever murders will be liable to judgement." But I say to you that everyone who is angry with his brother will be liable to judgement; whoever insults his brother will be liable to the council; and whoever says, "You fool!" will be liable to the hell of fire. So if you are offering your gift at the altar and there remember that your brother has something against you, leave your gift there before the altar and go. First be reconciled to your brother, and then come and offer your gift. Come to terms quickly with your accuser while you are going with him to court, lest your accuser hand you over to the judge, and the judge to the guard, and you be put in prison. Truly, I say to you, you will never get out until you have paid the last penny.'

'You have heard that it was said, "You shall not commit adultery." But I say to you that everyone who looks at a woman with lustful intent has already committed adultery with her in his heart. If your right eye causes you to sin, tear it out and throw it away. For it is better that you lose one of your members than that your whole body be thrown into hell. And if your right hand causes you to sin, cut it off and throw it away. For it is better that you lose one of your members than that your whole body go into hell.'

'It was also said, "Whoever divorces his wife, let him give her a certificate of divorce." But I say to you that everyone who divorces his wife, except on the ground of sexual immorality, makes her commit adultery, and whoever marries a divorced woman commits adultery.'

'Again you have heard that it was said to those of old, "You shall not swear falsely, but shall perform to the Lord what you have sworn." But I say to you: Do not take an oath at all, either by heaven, for it is the throne of God, or by the earth, for it is his footstool, or by Jerusalem, for it is the city of the great King. And do not take an oath by your head, for you cannot make one hair white or black. Let what you say be simply "Yes" or "No"; anything more than this comes from evil.'

### **Act of Spiritual Communion**

**My Jesus, I believe that You are present in the Most Holy Sacrament. I love You above all things and I desire to receive You into my soul. Since I cannot at this moment receive You sacramentally, come spiritually into my heart. I embrace You as if You were already there and unite myself wholly to You. Never permit me to be separated from You.**
